Hi Steve,

The draft of your presentation looks great! I like the way you start the presentation with slides that show the problems with lower ratings and scores in your area, and you also note challenges to your argument, which makes you more credible. The plan of action slide lays out your argument, although I would emphasize on slide 5 that you want to combine tablet technology with innovative pedagogical approaches like the “flipped classroom” to make the argument even more clear.

The text and visuals go together well, and I like the use of short titles as transitions from one slide to the next. As for the audience, if your main audience is the school board, you really need to address cost since that will be a primary concern. You mention partnerships on slide 11, but I am guessing the audience will want to know how much they will have to spend on this.

The layout of your presentation is definitely its strength, and you followed the good design rules for font size covered in Hood’s “Power Point Basics” workshop. The images you included are really clear and stand out nicely against the green background. I did notice that the early slides are mainly images and the last 4 slides are all text; is there a way you could integrate some images on those slides or change the slide order so that the presentation isn’t image-heavy up front and text-heavy in the last part? I think images of students bent over tablets, hard at work, as well as images of classrooms with students engaged with teachers or in group work situations

could help to reinforce your point that technology will build community as opposed to isolating students.

To generate interest in this presentation outside of class, maybe you could turn this presentation into a video that you could then post on your Facebook page or perhaps YouTube. The PSA reading in this week's Learning Activities might have some ideas that will help you to think about reaching a wider audience.
